Programme Overview

On **06 August 2021**, the **Eco-Schools Workshop 2** has been successfully hosted by the **Melaka Eco-Schools Programme** through an online platform with 37 representatives from 9 schools. It is a continuation of the previous Eco-Schools Workshop 1, discussing several key topics: **Environmental Review, Eco-Schools Methodology: Step 2 Process**, and **Environmental Review Forms (Excel and Word File Tour)**. A reminder was given to the participating schools on the Eco-Schools Audit Form and the addresses for the Eco-Schools Manual Submission. This workshop is conducted to help the participants gain a better understanding of the important elements of Step 2 of the Eco-Schools Methodology. This workshop mainly focuses on providing the participants with the vital steps to carry out the processes of Step 2. However, a more in-depth workshop will be given to each school, following a one-to-one schedule basis.

TOPICS DISCUSSED

1. Introduction Speech by Mr Sri

The workshop started off with Mr Sri, the Programme Director, welcoming the participants and guests, as well as briefly explaining the agendas for the workshop. After a short introduction, Mr Sri invited Dr Mahadi to give his greetings before officially starting the event.

2. Keynote Speech by Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Ts. Haji Idris Bin Haji Haron

Participants have been introduced to the respective guest. Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Ts. Haji Idris Bin Haji Haron followed by Tuan Haji Jamsari Mariman. Datuk Seri Utama Ir. Ts. Haji Idris Bin Haji Haron reiterated ways for society to shape the minds of the youth towards the building of a thoughtful generation. The keynote speeches given were intended to motivate the participants to achieve higher and better in the Eco-schools program for the years to come.

3. Environmental Review

Mr Sri explained that he will be presenting about the Environmental Review but will not go deeper for Analysis as it will be explained in a 1-to-1 session in the future. A reminder to submit the Audit Form and Eco-Schools Manual was also given to the schools that have yet to return theirs.

4. Eco-Schools Methodology: Step 2 Process

The topic covers teachers' responsibility to help students answer their scorecard by informing them of the performance of the school. It will be based on the 12 themes of Eco-Schools, including the additional one, communication. After answering the scorecard, they will also be needed to transfer the data into an Excel File to identify the 3 critical themes that should be paid attention to. The participants have also been informed about the updated version of the form to ensure the process went smoothly for the students.

5. Environmental Review Forms (Excel and Word File Tour)

Mr Sri explained the process of filling up the forms in order to help the representatives understand how the Environmental Review form works. The tour of the Word was demonstrated by Mr Sri, giving the participants a clearer view of the type of contents needed to be inserted. Afterwards, the session proceeded with a demonstration of the Excel file in order to determine the school's three (3) critical themes.

6. Announcement

At the end of the workshop, participants were reminded once again to submit their Eco-Schools Audit Forms. They were also informed that there will be a Google Sites Workshop happening on 17 August 2021. It is to give exposure to the participating schools on ways to utilise Google Sites for their Eco-Schools Programme reports. Before ending the session, the e-attendance was distributed through link sharing in the chatbox for the participants to fill in as evidence that they have attended the seminar.

RECEPTION OF PARTICIPANTS

Nine registered schools under Eco-Schools Melaka were represented. The attendance list could be found on **pages 4 and 5** of this programme report. Overall, the workshop received positive feedback from the participants, which include the teachers, parents and students. The participants gave great cooperation throughout the workshop, which can be seen when they listened attentively to the presentation and unmuted only when necessary. Several of them asked questions at the end of the workshop to ensure that they are understanding things correctly. With the interest and cooperation that they give, the programme is expected to be conducted as planned.

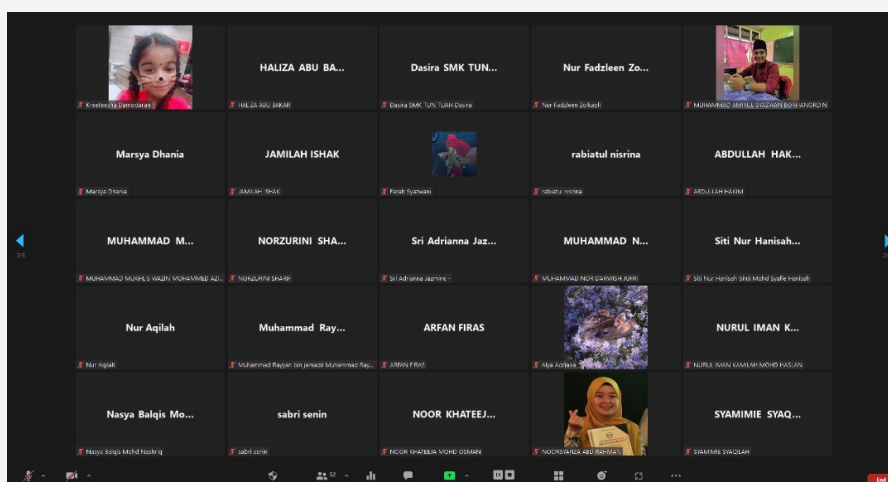
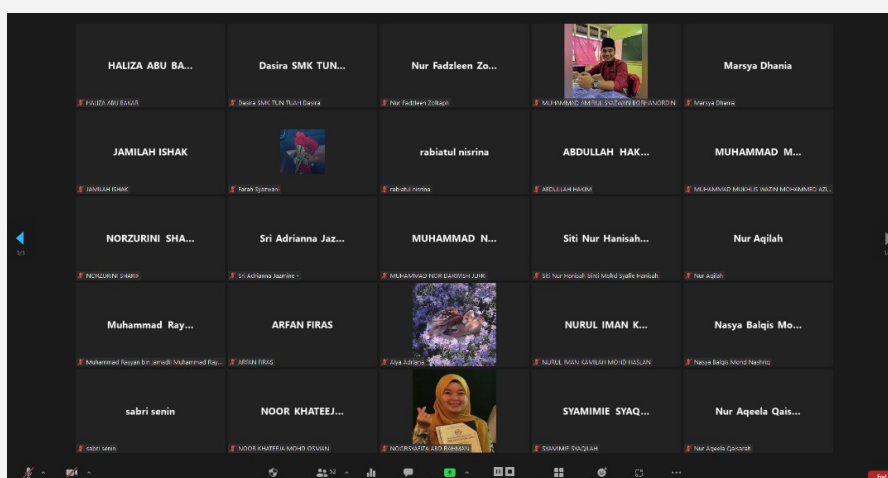
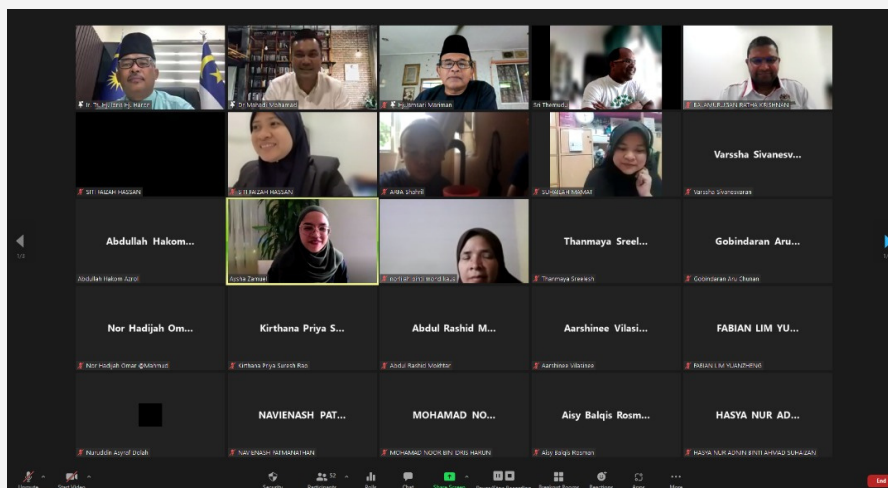
MOVING FORWARD

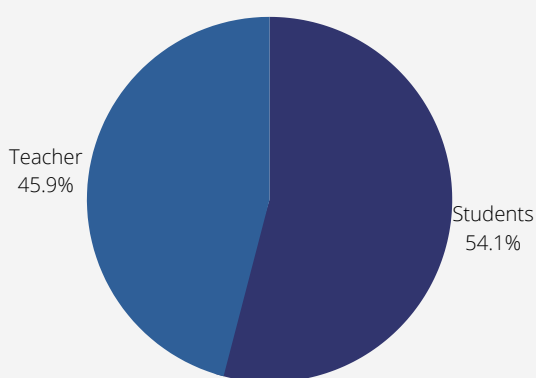

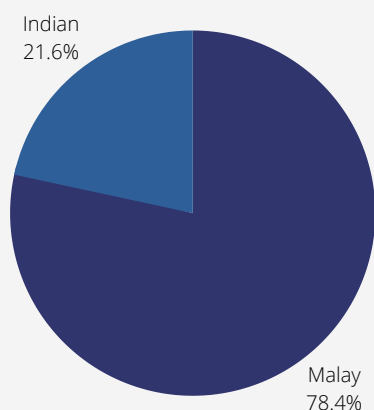
