PROGRAMME DETAILS

Programme Overview

On 23 July 2021, Green Growth Asia Foundation successfully hosted the NYRE: Ask Me Anything webinar (Bahasa Malaysia) virtually with participants consisting of teachers and students from twelve schools in Malaysia. The webinar provides an overview of the NYRE 2021 competitions, touching on key points relating to each competition from the three media categories: the aim of each competition, the participation terms, and the evaluation criteria. The webinar also includes a Q&A session to give the participants the opportunity to ask questions regarding the NYRE competitions. This webinar is the first of its kind, and with that, a number of elements were taken into consideration in terms of its virtual implementation. This webinar is hosted by environmental education interns, All of the feedback and suggestions have been received and will be taken into practice for the next online webinar sessions. The development of the second NYRE: Ask Me Anything webinar (English Language) soon follows.

TOPICS DISCUSSED

1. Requirements to be a part of National Young Reporters of the Environment Programs.

- The NYRE programs may include young people aged 11-25 years.
- By participating in the competition, young people are empowered to have their voice on environmental concerns in their community that they believe are not being sufficiently addressed.
- Young Environmental Reporters (YRE) is an international programme managed by the Environmental Education Foundation (FEE)
- The program provides young people with the ability to take an educated position on environmental concerns and gives them a platform to communicate with them through writing, photography and video media.

2. Environmental Videography Competition

- Up to 2 participants are allowed to join.
- Is open to all Category students at the age of 11 25.
- The video should be done in the format of video reports and environmental campaigns video.
- The videos should be linked to pollution, loss of biodiversity and climate change and should present a strong relationship with sustainable development goals (SDGs).
- The aim of the reporting video is to serve as a short documentary based on news, events, history, facts and the aim of the environmental campaign film is to create awareness of an issue with the aim of promoting particular values and to motivate positive action via video.

3. Photography Competition

- Only 1 participant is allowed to join.
- Is open to all Category students at the age of 11 25.
- The photography competition requirements should be completed in three forms: a photo report, a single photo campaign, and a photo tale consisting of only three to five photographs.
- The photo should be in JPEG or PNG format.
- The images must be shared on at least three social media sites.
- The photos should be linked to pollution, loss of biodiversity and climate change and should present a strong relationship with sustainable development goals (SDGs).
- The goal of the photography competition is to assist the public in better comprehend the environmental problem, event, or phenomena.

4. Article Writing Competition

- Up to 2 participants are allowed to join.
- Is open to all Category students at the age of 11 25.
- The sole condition for the article writing competition is that only one piece must be submitted.
- The article writing must be shared on at least three social media sites.
- The article writing competition should be linked to pollution, loss of biodiversity and climate change and should present a strong relationship with sustainable development goals (SDGs).
- The goal of a 'Written Article' is to convey a story about an issue that affects your region or the globe, and to share it with the public both locally and globally. Through the prism of the environment, it attempts to present a real and accurate tale.






RECEPTION OF PARTICIPANTS




MOVING FORWARD

Facebook Analytics

The NYRE: Ask Me Anything webinar (Bahasa Malaysia) was streamed on its Facebook Page. The recorded session can be viewed at https://www.facebook.com/yremalaysia/videos/3212813002279449

The stream was live for an hour and ten minutes, from 2:40 P.M. to 3:50 P.M. (GMT+8). The live stream analytics are divided into three separate categories; stream analysis will discuss how the live stream performs, audience engagement that outlines the public reaction, and the public and demographic profiles that identify audience profile.

STREAM ANALYSIS

In total, we have reached **63 people**; the following is the breakdown;

Live Session LIVE

During the live stream, we have a total of **25 viewers** that stay until the end. This is a significant number of viewers as the stream was **a one hour-long** session.

Recorded Session •REC

After the live stream, the post remains available for viewing on Young Reporters for Environment Malaysia Facebook Page, in which **78 people viewed the session for three seconds**, with **35 people staying for a minute**. Data as of July 26, 2021.

On average, viewers who decided to stay spend almost **6:46** extracting information from the AMA event. The growing numbers of viewers are attributed to the mass promotion by the participating teachers to their colleagues, friends and family.

34.8% of the total views came from recommendations, While **65.2%** came from our existing followers, This indicates that our followers are updated with our events, and **another 0.2%** came from the **2** recorded shares.

AUDIENCE ENGAGEMENT

Overall, NYRE: Ask Me Anything webinar was well received. A total of **42 audience engagements** are recorded, with **30 reactions**, **10 comments** and **2 shares**. The breakdown is as follow:


